However, as the interior of the Church has been painted, carpeted and the flooring installed we feel comfortable in allowing small groups of renters and the recording of music to return to the Church building. Still, all need to be very careful when walking around as large and small items are scattered around. Please be careful. We are still in the midst of a pandemic. CDC guidelines **MUST** be observed.

Please read and follow the guidelines below.

Guidelines for Renters and Congregation regarding church use.

Safety is our most important issue.

Please schedule your time in the church with Cathy Jackson. If you plan to use the church, schedule with Cathy Jackson for a meeting to make sure that you will not run into another group. No more than one group will be scheduled at any given time frame.

You **MUST** follow CDC guidelines:

Wear a mask upon entering the church. Your Mask may be removed for deep breathing classes such as Yoga, meditation, etc. If you do not have a mask, **do not** enter the church. Local drugstores sell masks.

Wash your hands frequently. Bring your own hand sanitizer as ours has “walked away” at various times so we cannot guarantee that hand sanitizer will be present.

Keep Social distance even while you are wearing masks.

SCHEDULE ALL EVENTS WITH CATHY JACKSON

If you go to the church at an unscheduled time and find a scheduled group present. Please return when there is no scheduled group present.

Our finance and staff work in closed rooms with an outside door so they will come and go as needed.

The 4th Century Theological Battle for the Trinity

Reverend Kathryn Tew Rickey

Wednesday, November 11, 2020, 4:00—5:30 p.m.

Reverend Kathy Tew Rickey will deliver a talk on "The 4th Century Theological Battle for the Trinity." This will be a follow-up to her presentation of "Developments in Early Christianity" last month. Reverend Kathy will present the key events that led to the Council of Nicaea in 325 CE in which two church fathers, Arius and Athanasius argued the divinity of Jesus and the notion of a triune god. She'll examine their arguments for and against the Doctrine of the Trinity. She'll also trace a thread of non-Trinitarianism revived during the Protestant Reformation, making way for the beginnings of Unitarianism in Europe.

Kathy Tew Rickey is an ordained Unitarian Universalist (UU) minister. She serves the UU Congregation of Ormond Beach. Rev. Rickey has served congregations in Rochester, Syracuse, and Cortland, New York. She also served as a hospital chaplain in Rochester. Before becoming a minister, Rev. Rickey was a

banking consultant and continuing education teacher. She raised two daughters and several dogs while living in various places in the Eastern U.S. Over the years, she has taught many adult and youth religious education courses in the context of congregational life.

Jung was one of the major figures in the early development of both theoretical & applied psychology. There has always been a question as to whether he was as much a mystic as a psychologist. While he is no longer a significant influence in mainstream psychology he continues to be of interest for many people.

Dr. Dan Kennedy is retired from a career that combined psychology & education, spent mainly in university settings (Univ of Oregon, Univ of Hawaii, & Florida International Univ). In retirement he has been involved in study of a variety of areas & in various adult education activities.
