Straight Up SolGier is a local non-profit organization that provides free professional counseling for local children and adults who have been sexually abused. Our Share-the-Plate partner for June was established by the parents of Matt McGuirk, who at age 10, was sexually assaulted by a teacher. Matt lived with mental pain from the sexual abuse until, at age 31, he died of a self-medicating drug overdose. An avid surfer, Matt had grown up in Daytona Beach and was committed to helping others. He had drawn the SolGier logo in 2007. Today, children and adults in Volusia County, including several senior citizens, are benefiting from the free therapy provided by this organization.
