Helen Casoli's visit with GOD'S BATHHOUSE organization

The charity GOD'S BATHHOUSE is our June share the plate charity. This is a very unique charity. Elizabeth and her husband Elgie drive a converted mid-sized truck to various churches 4 days a week. This truck has been outfitted with 2 showers. I had the opportunity to see the truck this morning when I delivered a carload of clothes to their home in Deland. How unique! Elizabeth told me they give 450 showers a week to the homeless who come to their truck parked in a church parking lot. They each get a shower, new underwear and socks, a bag of gently used clothes, personal hygiene products and sometimes a gift card from a restaurant such as McDonalds, Burger King or Wendy's.

Right now, with Covid-19, the churches are closed, therefore no showers are being offered. However, Elizabeth and Elgie still bundle together bags full of needy items and hand them out to the homeless in the towns they serve. These towns include New Smyrna, Daytona Beach, Port Orange, Ormond Beach and their home town of Deland. I asked her this morning what she is most desperate for. She praised repeatedly our donations that she received today. When pressed, she said she and Elgie buy underwear and socks and gift cards so the homeless will be able to eat .

They will be in our UUCOB parking lot next Friday the 17th by our invitation, from 10:00 A.M. - 11:00 A.M. They will be handing out previously bundled bundles to the homeless. They will have several volunteers with them plus Rev Kathy and me.

Anyone of us can bring the following items to them at that time, or drop them off at my house beforehand. I am categorizing the clothes by sex and size for them.

These are the items they need: gently used clean men's and women's summer clothes all sizes, personal items incl shavers, deodorant, women's personal items, soaps, shampoos, new underwear, new socks, gift cards for food.

If anyone feels uncomfortable coming out, I will come and pick up your offering. My address is 9 Choctaw Trail, Ormond Beach, 508-221-5336.
