

Marlboro Man, Over-Individualism in America

Wednesday, January 8, 2020, 4:00-5:30 pm Reverend Kathy Tew Rickey

This LLL program will discuss the book, "Constructing the Self, Constructing America" by Philip Cushman. It's a very interesting work about the history and development of psychology and therapeutic practice in America. The author says America got Freud wrong and as a result we now live in a society with too much emphasis on rugged individualism (like the lone cowboy depicted in Marlborough cigarette advertisements). Over-individualism has far reaching implications, not only for mental health, but also for the way in which we Americans tend to over-consume material goods.

Reverend Kathy Tew Rickey is an ordained Unitarian Universalist minister with a Master of Divinity degree from Meadville Lombard Theological School in Chicago, Illinois. She has served the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Ormond Beach since 2016. Reverend Rickey also co-chairs the FAITH Community Organization of Volusia County and teaches World Religions at Daytona State College, Daytona Beach, Florida.




**Wednesday, January 22, 2020, 4:00-5:30 pm. Literature of the Sea
Jim Cunningham**

This LLL session will begin with an overview of the role our oceans have played in early, and even current, human cultural development – leading to enlightening literature in each era. Then the session will explore “The Seafarer” (904 AD), a snip-it from Homer’s Odyssey, a short passage from Ben Franklin’s “Journal of a Voyage”, all of Samuel Taylor Coleridge’s “Rime of the Ancient Mariner”, and look at a few more poems: Emily Dickinson’s “Exultation is the going”, Marianne Moore’s “A Grave”, Robert Frost’s “Neither Out Far Nor In Deep”, Langston Hughes’ “Sea Calm”, and finally, Robert Louis Stevenson’s “Christmas at Sea

Jim Cunningham has taught literature and other areas of the humanities for forty-four years. In addition, Jim has served as Chair of the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and more recently as Associate Vice President, Academics and Director of the Study Abroad Programs at Embry-Riddle. And finally, he is an excellent sailor and a lover of the sea.
