Brittany Packnett presented the annual Ware Lecture at this year's Unitarian Universalist Association General Assembly in Kansas City, Missouri. President Barack Obama described Packnett as a leader who's "voice is going to be making a difference for years to come." The UUA calls Brittany "an unapologetic educator, organizer, writer, and speaker." She is vice-president of National Community Alliances for Teach for America, where she leads partnerships and civil rights work with communities of color. Brittany is a strong social activist— she was a protestor at Ferguson and helped to found Campaign Zero, to help

end police violence.
